Below is an overview of the many projects that faculty and staff executed during the last year to study the effectiveness of HCC's instruction and support services. This work is mandated by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) via its requirements for accreditation (Standard V: [Educational Effectiveness Assessment](#)).

Assessment of Student Learning Outcomes within the Classroom

The director of learning outcomes assessment, a research associate, and a research analyst work closely with faculty in collaboration with the provost and her associate vice presidents to assess student learning within the classroom including, but not limited to, general education goal reviews, assessment of high impact practices within the office of academic engagement, program and course reviews, as well as consult on faculty promotion projects and grants. The Learning Outcomes Assessment office (LOA) administrates the general education subcommittee, which conducts discussions about business, curriculum, and assessment processes related to general education; manages the general education dashboard; reviews assessment results; creates recommendations for student learning and process improvements; and oversees curriculum changes to the general education core.

Listed next is an overview of the general education reports, general education subcommittee work, academic engagement projects, program reviews, course reviews, and other projects/initiatives underway during fiscal year (FY) 2025. Shading is provided to ease the reading transition from one goal, academic division, or person to the next.

General Education Goal Reviews

The second cycle of general education assessment ended in June of 2023. FY2024 was a designated year of reflection where goal teams (cross-divisional representation of faculty participating in the goal, tasked with ensuring that goal's implementation) began submitting comprehensive cycle 2 summary reports, and the general education subcommittee conducted an audit of general education processes and submitted a report to leadership. To date, four of the nine goal teams have completed their summary reports and held town halls to disseminate the information to faculty and staff across HCC. Two of the goal teams have submitted drafts and been given feedback from the general education subcommittee and are working on revisions of their reports. The final three goal teams are working on the first drafts of their reports. Additionally, the subcommittee completed their audit and submitted a proposal for cycle 3 changes to leadership in the fall of 2024. Fall 2024 began cycle 3 of general education assessment.

Assessment of Student Learning Outcomes Outside the Classroom

Throughout FY25, the Research and Planning team continued its support of the Student Success area as the college finalized its student services reorganization. The team delivered key data and analysis, including reports on duplicated and unduplicated headcounts, fall-to-fall retention, and degree completions (FY20 to FY24) for programs such as Ambiciones, Howard PRIDE, and the Parent Scholars Program. Insights revealed that student success program participants continued to outperform comparator groups in retention rates. Additionally, the team provided rankings of academic majors for student-athletes to guide donor outreach. Beyond enrollment and student outcomes, the team supported recruitment efforts and conducted an in-depth analysis for the Basic Needs Task Force, leveraging student feedback from the 2024 YESS survey. The Provost reviewed the design and outcomes of the previous cycle of student services program reviews and is now working with her team and PROD to design and deploy a new cycle for the assessment process for student support programs.
