RN to BSN Articulation Agreement
between
Howard Community College
and
Notre Dame of Maryland University

I. PURPOSE

Notre Dame of Maryland University, Inc. (Notre Dame) and Howard Community College (HOCC) enter into this Articulation Agreement (Agreement) so that students enrolled in the RN (Registered Nursing) program will have a clear understanding of how their credits will transfer to Notre Dame in the **RN to Bachelor of Science in Nursing** (BSN) program.

This Agreement facilitates the transfer of prospective graduates and graduates of HOCC to Notre Dame and provides valuable advising tools for the student's first two years of study at the community college. Students need to receive their Associate degree prior to enrolling at Notre Dame to be eligible for consideration under this agreement.

II. ASSIGNED RESPONSIBILITIES

A. Notre Dame will:

- 1. Accept the program requirements that HOCC students complete for the RN program as outlined in the Articulation documents included with this agreement and as stated in the Notre Dame Transfer Policy.
- 2. Accept transfer-appropriate courses with a grade of "C" or better, up to a maximum of 68 credits in transfer.
- 3. Continue working with HOCC on detailed articulation agreements that provide guidelines on additional program to program transfer.
- 4. Provide opportunities for HOCC students to participate in activities on the Notre Dame campus prior to enrollment.

C. TERMINATION CLAUSE

- 1. Either party may terminate this Agreement at the end of the initial term or at the end of a renewed term by giving the other party at least one year prior written notice. Such termination, however, will not apply to students already accepted to the Notre Dame.
- 2. This Agreement may be terminated by either party at any time due to a material default of its terms by the other as long as the default has not been cured within a ninety (90) day period from written notice of the default.

D. MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. This Agreement is not assignable but shall bind the corporate successors of Notre Dame and HOCC.
- 2. This Agreement will not create an employment or partnership relationship between Notre Dame and HOCC.
- 3. No amendment to this Agreement shall be valid and binding unless in writing signed by both parties.
- 4. Notice of any action taken by either party and required to be reported to the other party under this Agreement shall be mailed, certified delivery, to the other party at the address stated below:
